## O'Brien & Ryan's Partner Alan Focht Dead at 44

lan Wade Focht, a skilled, zealous and honorable advocate for the legal community, died Sept. 27 at Jeanes Hospital after a long battle with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma.

A native of Altoona, Pa., Mr. Focht graduated from Altoona Area High School in 1978. He then attended Penn State University and worked as a practicum for the District Attorney's Office.
